An outstandingly good quality **Congreve** rolling ball clock, made by Andrew Fell, with a fifteen second tilting table, and seconds indication given by means of a dial and a sliding indicator above the paths taken by the ball, as well as hour and minute dials. Mounted on a marble base, under a glass case with brass corners.

S1316 (Ex. Job number 06002)

An early eighteenth century cased **lantern clock** of unusually small size, mounted in an associated narrow oak case approximately six feet high with a removable hood, sometimes called a "pencil case", the single handed weight driven movement with verge escapement and an alarm, the dial with separate chapter ring, date setting ring, and a silvered convex circle in the arch signed "Wentworth, Oxon". This would be George Wentworth, son of Thomas of Salisbury, who worked in Oxford, was born in 1692, and died in 1746.

This rare variety of clock was developed because the weight hanging down on a cord was vulnerable to children and animals, and it was found desirable to enclose it in a case. This was a precursor to the long case clocks which eventually took over as the standard domestic clock together with the spring driven bracket clocks.

This clock has been most thoroughly overhauled to a very high standard in our own workshops, and is now in excellent condition throughout and going well.
